- Houma IC estimates that approximately **101 miles** of Louisiana shoreline has been impacted to date. Most of the impact was by "light" sheening. Of the 101 miles of shoreline impacted, about **31 miles** of shoreline had cleanable oil.

- Using Riser Insertion Tube Tool (RITT); (22,158 bbls of oil collected to date as of 5/26/10)
- RITT-2 pre-staged on sea floor.
- RITT-3 on sea floor.
- Top Kill: commenced 1400 EST, 5/26/10, scheduled to resume 1200 EST 5/27/10
- Top Hat Containment System remains on seabed; standing by. Two additional top hat containment systems lowered to sea floor; a 4th is in production.
