- Houma IC estimates that approximately 128 miles of Louisiana shoreline is currently impacted. Approximately 61 miles of shoreline had Medium, Heavy or Tar Balls. Approximately 34 miles of shoreline actively being cleaned.

- Flow Rate Technical Group (FRTG) estimated leak rate: 12,000 - 19,000 bbl per day (estimate was prior to top hat; more current estimate not available.)
- DD-III Relief well status: 13,978 ft from drill rig floor (performing choke line BOP test, drilling ahead, 40% estimated completion).
- DD-II Relief well status: 9,022 ft from drill rig floor (drilling ahead for 18" liner section)
- Top Hat: 96,476 bbl of oil has been recovered as of 1200 06/11/10. Top Hat Flow Collection Gauge being installed to better calculate flow rates.
- Q4000 test completed, preparation for start-up begin. Operations expected to begin late afternoon today.
- Subsea dispersant continues to be injected.
