 - Houma IC estimates that approximately **142* miles** of Louisiana shoreline has been impacted to date. Most of the impact was by "light" sheening. Approximately **61 miles** of shoreline had Medium, Heavy or Tar Balls. Approximately **35 miles** of shoreline actively being cleaned. (* Yesterday's total was reported in error, it should have been approximately 137 total miles impacted with 59 miles of cleanable shoreline).

- Top Hat: lowered Top Hat #4 on LMRP; working to close first valve; injecting methanol and hot water to prevent hydrate crystal formation; Oil and Gas flowing from Top Hat to Enterprise.
